



Full Time Artist/Teacher of Cello

The Conservatory of Music at Baldwin Wallace University seeks applicants for a full-time tenure-track artist/teacher of Cello. The position is Assistant Professor rank and begins on August 1, 2021.

The successful candidate will be an accomplished cellist, outstanding teacher, and versatile artist who is committed to helping Conservatory students prepare for dynamic and unpredictable careers as performing artists, educators, and leaders. The successful candidate will teach an undergraduate cello studio that includes performance, music education, and music therapy majors; coach chamber ensembles; play an active role in the recruitment of students for the Conservatory and the University; actively participate in faculty chamber music on and off campus; provide positive leadership for Conservatory colleagues and students, along with public school teachers and alumni; maintain an excellent reputation as a performer and pedagogue; perform other institutional service typically required of a full-time faculty member (advising, committee service, coordinating aspects of the string department, community outreach, etc.); teach other courses based on candidate's expertise or the Conservatory's needs.

Required qualifications: Compelling artistic background in classical music performance; demonstrated record of excellent teaching; demonstrated commitment to developing the artistic and educational growth of undergraduate music students; required masters degree, though preference will be given to candidates with an earned doctoral degree (PhD or DMA) by the start date; potential for scholarship through artistic endeavors such as performances, conference presentations, recordings, and publications. Additional consideration will be given to candidates with secondary interest or experience in music extending beyond the boundaries of traditional classical music performance. These secondary areas could include one or more of the following: music technology, improvisation, entrepreneurship, composition, applications of multicultural or commercial music in an applied studio, or other research interests.

Please submit: Cover letter; Curriculum Vita; one-page statement of individual teaching/leadership philosophy; one or more internet links to recent recorded public performances - video is preferred, audio is acceptable (additional recordings may be requested later in the process); contact information for 3 or more professional references (including e-mail and phone numbers).
