



Engineering Faculty Tenure Track

The School of Natural Sciences, Mathematics and Computing at Baldwin Wallace University announces a tenure track faculty position in Engineering, to begin August 2019. The School seeks an individual with experience in and commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching, student advising and directing undergraduate projects and research. A Ph.D. in an engineering area or related discipline is required. Preference will be given to candidates in Mechanical Engineering. Professional Engineering (PE) licensure is desirable. The engineering program is in its second year and will be working toward external accreditation. The curriculum includes rigorous foundational courses in the basic sciences, mathematics and computing coupled with a strong set of engineering courses. The major culminates in a two-semester senior capstone project. Preference will be given to candidates that can teach a wide variety of courses at all levels, develop and conduct laboratory experiences, and participate in curriculum development and assessment for the major program.
