



Baldwin Wallace University Medical-Surgical Nursing Faculty Position

The Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing (ABSN) program at Baldwin Wallace University invites applications for a **full-time, tenure track or non-tenure track faculty member** depending on qualifications, from nurses with significant teaching and leadership experience at either the collegiate level or in a hospital setting.

Responsibilities:

- Teach medical surgical nursing concepts and exemplars in the didactic and lab or clinical setting.
- Prepare students to think critically and communicate accurately and effectively.
- Implement teaching and learning strategies that support student application of theoretical learning in all settings.
- Create an environment that fosters student learning in all settings.
- Evaluate student performance and provide feedback to enhance student learning.
- Advise and mentor students
- Engage in service opportunities at the department, college and university levels.
- Engage in professional development and scholarship opportunities.

Required (Minimum) Qualifications:

- At least two years of experience as a registered nurse
- Evidence of didactic and clinical competency in medical-surgical nursing
- An unencumbered license as a registered nurse in the state of Ohio.
- Clean background check and drug screen (to be done after interview)
- Earned nursing degree:
 - Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) – required if the basic nursing degree is not a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN).
 - Applicants with a BSN and a master's degree in a non-nursing field will be considered.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Earned doctorate degree: PhD, DNP or EdD degree
- Earned MSN degree with a specialization in Nursing Education or coursework in instruction, curriculum development and student evaluation.
- Professional experience in a medical-surgical health setting
- Nursing scholarship including experience in research methodologies.
