Assistant Professor of Public Health -Tenure Track Faculty Positions

The Department of Public Health & Prevention Science at Baldwin Wallace University invites applications for (2) two tenure track faculty positions from qualified candidates with strong teaching and research experience in the following areas: **i) Spatial epidemiology/Data Sciences/Health Informatics with expertise and a strong record of application of modern methods of data collection (i.e., mobile apps, social media, remote sensing, ecological momentary assessment) and advanced spatial analytics (i.e., GIS mapping, temporal-spatial analysis, risk surface modeling); ii) health education and promotion/ community health.** The anticipated start date for these positions is August 1, 2019.

The successful candidate will be expected to: i) teach within both the Undergraduate and Graduate program as well as contribute to University's Core curriculum; ii) establish and maintain an independent and/or collaborative research program with extramural funding; iii) serve on department and University committees; and v) assume other duties as assigned according to the successful candidate's strength and weaknesses.

The Department provides opportunities to work collaboratively within an exciting multi-disciplinary environment with strengths that include Global Health, Health Disparities, LGBT Health, Substance Abuse prevention & harm reduction, HIV/AIDS, and chronic disease management. Required Qualifications: i) PhD or DrPH in Spatial Epidemiology/ health analytics/ data science/ community health/ health education & health promotion and/or a relevant Public Health discipline from an accredited Graduate Public Health Program; ii) Evidence of competence in teaching university level Public Health courses; iii) Ability to articulate research agenda and/or demonstrate scholarship in spatial epidemiology/health analytics/community health/ population health management and/or promotion and/or expertise in using noble population health methods.

Preferred Qualifications: i) Post-doctoral experiences; ii) Prior teaching experience; iii) Demonstrated capabilities for attracting extramural research funding, iv) Experience in working with domestic and/or public health and/or community based agencies/or, v) Expertise in advance analytical methods using large datasets; vi) GIS applications; vii) Training/knowledge of the Social Determinants of Health, including social justice and health equity, iv) CHES/MCHES/CPH or eligible.
