



Studio Art Faculty

The Department of Art at Baldwin Wallace University (BW) is seeking a full-time, tenure-track faculty member to teach undergraduate classes in 3D studies beginning August 1, 2019. There is a need for a qualified professional with expertise in the areas of ceramics, 3D design and sculpture beginning fall semester, 2019. Candidate must possess an undergraduate degree in Studio Art, along with an M.F.A. in ceramics and the ability to teach classes in both throwing and hand-building. Preference will be given to applicants with experience working with other materials in addition to clay. The faculty will supervise and teach in the 3D studies program that includes 3D Design, Introduction to Ceramics, Introduction to Sculpture in addition to Intermediate and Advanced Ceramics as well as Advanced Sculpture. Along with a knowledge of glazing chemistry, the individual must have the expertise to maintain and operate the four electric kilns, a complex gas kiln, a pug mill and other equipment. Responsibilities include the ordering and maintenance of supplies, chemicals, and various materials. In addition, the faculty will serve as an advisor to Studio Art and Graphic Design majors, serve on committees, curate exhibitions, and participate in assessment. Applicants must submit a portfolio for review.
